All Star vs. All Star Elite

In line with the new USASF All-Star divisions FUNDamentals, All-Star Novice, All-Star Prep, and All-Star Elite. CheerFactor is pleased to offer All-Star and All-Star Elite for our Full year teams this season.

What is the difference in the TWO divisions here at CheerFactor?

- All Star will compete in the USASF All-Star PREP division
- All Star will compete to earn a bid to the US finals at the end of the season held in Providence
- All Star competitive skill requirements are less than those of All-Star Elite and more than All-Star Novice
- All Star levels offered will be 1.1, 2.1, 3.1 and 3.2
- All-Star at CFAS will practice 4 hours per week and a tumbling hour will NOT be included
- All-Star will not travel to Atlantic City
- All-Star will have in-house choreography
- All Star will have less expensive Competition Fees
- All Star will have lower Tuition
- All Star Elite will run similar to how we have run our Full-Year teams prior to this season

What will be the same?

- The coaches will be the same between All Star and All Star Elite
- The uniforms will be the same
- Competition schedules will be very similar
- Commitment to your team and your teams success will be the same for BOTH divisions

What locations will offer All Star and All Star Elite?

- It is our goal to offer both All Star and All Star Elite at Hanover and Foxboro
- Taunton will offer All Star ONLY

All Star vs. All Star Elite

How do I know what division is right for my athlete/family? Things to consider?

The USASF definition of All Star Elite..... **ACHIEVE EXCEL MASTER**

The USASF definition of All Star.....**TRAIN COMPETE SUCCEED**

- Cost.....All Star will be less expensive but offer a very similar experience to All Star Elite
- Skill Level.....CheerFactor's All Star Elite teams will be built very conservative this season. Athletes will be expected to have a MASTERY of the elite skills within the division in levels 1, 2, 3 and 4. Level R5 and Level 5 teams will be built with the most elite athletes, offering the most skills for these divisions - Both Stunting and Tumbling. In the current All Star Elite climate with the quest of Summit bids, teams across the country are getting stronger and stronger. CheerFactor intends to put out top notch teams this season to compete with the very best of the All Star Elite divisions nation wide.
- CheerFactors All Star teams will also be built to be top notch in their respective divisions. The requirements for these teams on the score sheet are less. The All Star levels being offered will allow athletes without solid and elite level 2 and 3 skills the opportunity to expand their skill sets further by allowing them to stunt at a higher level than in All-Star Elite with a lower level tumbling requirement.
- All Star Elite (non-worlds) will compete for a BID to The Summit. All Star teams will compete for a BID to the US Finals and are not eligible for a BID to The Summit. All Star athletes will be eligible to be Summit fill-ins, should the need arise at the end of the season.
- Owners will go over these new divisions in depth at the May 20th Parent Meetings as well as answer any questions that will help you decide what program is best for your athlete.
